Tarrant's Loss

TOUGH, TALENTED and tenacious.

Assistant District Attorney Terri Moore (pictured below) made a name in Tarrant County for the take-no-prisoners attitude she has displayed in and out of the courtroom.

After nine years in the district attorney's office, Moore has lost only four of 93 jury trials. She has never lost a murder or capital murder trial.

It's understandable why U.S. Attorney Paul Coggins has tapped the aggressive young lawyer for his federal office,

where she'll be prosecuting violent crimes beginning May 1.

Tarrant County District Attorney Tim Curry said that Moore was a role model for the female prosecutors in his office. We take that one step further: Moore, who went after criminals with an unbridled passion for justice, is a role model for anyone working in criminal courts.

Tarrant County is losing an important weapon in its war on crime.
